WILLIAMSBURG/JAMES CITY COUNTY CIRCUIT COURT
CRIMINAL FINES/COSTS/RESTITUTION PAYMENT AGREEMENTS

A Defendant must report to the Clerk's Office after sentencing unless otherwise advised or taken immediately into custody. Once a defendant reports to the Clerk's Office he/she may enter into a payment agreement without a down payment **unless he/she is delinquent on prior court costs in this Court**. Defendant's monthly payment plan amount may vary depending on financial circumstances and will be determined by the Clerk/Deputy Clerk. The goal of this Office is to help in being successful in paying your court costs and restitution.

Upon a defendant's release from incarceration, contact the Clerk's Office to let the Clerk/Deputy Clerk know of your release date and your desire to enter into a payment agreement.

Once a defendant has defaulted on an account, he/she must bring in a cash payment to be determined by the Clerk/Deputy Clerk to re-start a payment plan. Once the new agreement has been signed and payment has been made, the Clerk's Office will issue a DC-30 for the defendant to take to DMV. Defendants are required to pay any fees or other requirements by DMV.

Defendants will only be allowed three (3) opportunities at payment plans. Once the third agreement goes into default there are no opportunities for future payment plans or community service. The only way the defendant can have the suspension removed from their DMV record is to pay the account in full. Defaulted accounts are also transmitted to the Court Debt Collection Office with the Department of Taxation. This may lead to income garnishments and tax return garnishments.

Defendants may setup community service if there is no restitution owed and the account is not in default. The defendant must get approval from the Clerk's Office prior to turning in any hours. Defendants will be given 7 days to return the approval form with the location that has been selected along with that locations information. All community service hours must be completed on the due date which is assigned by the Clerk's Office. That date is based on the defendant performing 40 hours per month at a rate of \$7.50 per hour. Defendants will be given one (1) opportunity to perform community service in lieu of a payment plan.

**Order for the Payment of Fines and Costs
Pursuant to § 19.2-354(C)**

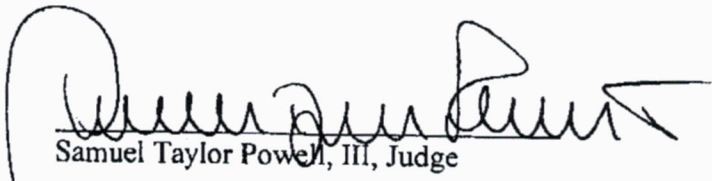
Pursuant to Virginia Code Section 19.2-354(C), the Court establishes this program to provide an option to any person upon whom a fine and costs have been imposed to discharge all or part of the fine or costs by earning credits for the performance of community service work before or after imprisonment.

The type of work, place of work and employer must be approved in writing by the office of adult probation in advance of the performance of the community service work.

The community service work shall be of the type that benefits residents of the City of Williamsburg or County of James City.

The rate of credit shall be seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) per hour.
